Our Members operate historic electric tramways in most Australian Capital, five regional and four New Zealand cities including some with a steam tram or replica cable car operation. They provide passenger services in most cases or enable a static display where you can board and relive the days where, if you lived in a metropolitan area, you most likely travelled by an often crowded smoke filled tram to work, shopping or the theatre.

Some of our members even have Conductors that will sell you a ticket for a ride on the vehicle and pick you up at a tram stop.
